The Radow College Student Success Summit brings faculty together to share practical, evidence-informed strategies that strengthen student learning, engagement, persistence, and success in the humanities and social sciences.

PRESENT

Faculty are encouraged to share effective practices, innovations, tools, or teaching approaches that support student success.

Presenters must complete the **Application Form** by September 18, which requires the following:

1. Presentation title
2. Abstract, up to one hundred words.
3. Identify the primary insights, skills, or strategies participants will gain.
4. Identify a session format: individual presentation, co-presentation, workshop, or roundtable.
5. Ideal session length

Presenters receive \$750 in travel or professional development funds. See funding note.

ATTEND

Attendees should leave with practical ideas and resources they can adapt for their own courses and teaching.

Attendees must complete an **Application Form** by September 18th and:

1. Participate in at least 80% of the event.
2. Submit a completed Student Success Teaching Practice Implementation Form, identifying a teaching practice, strategy, tool, or approach from the Summit to implement in a course within your program.
3. The form must be completed by 5:00 p.m. on December 4, 2026.

Attendees receive \$500 in travel or professional development funds upon completing requirements. See funding note.

All sessions will be held in technology-equipped classrooms in Prillaman Hall.

**APPLICATION DEADLINE: SEPTEMBER 18, 2026.
BOTH ATTENDEES AND PRESENTERS NEED TO APPLY.**

Funding note: Travel funding may be used for fall and/or spring travel, provided travel is confirmed by a submitted travel request by the required deadlines. Professional development funds must support skills, knowledge, or competencies related to your current role, such as HR-approved workshops, instructional materials, books that support instruction, or professional association memberships. Professional development funds must be spent by March 8, 2027. These purchases require multiple approvals, so work with your staff early to avoid last-minute issues. Funds not spent by the stated deadlines will be reallocated by the college.

Faculty who present at the summit are also considered attendees. The \$750 presenter funding amount already includes attendance, and \$750 is the maximum funding amount a faculty member may receive. Faculty may not receive both presenter funding and attendee funding.
