The Norman J. Radow College of Humanities and Social Sciences invites faculty to apply for the Merlin Wealth Management Financial Education Innovators Initiative, which supports the integration of financial education concepts into courses through creative, discipline-specific assignments and learning activities.

Participating faculty will receive a one-time \$500 inaugural stipend to incorporate one or more badges from the Merlin Wealth Management Financial Literacy Micro-Credential Collection into a course, using them as a springboard for innovative content, theory, discussion, projects, or other learning experiences.

Eligibility Requirements

The proposed activity must meaningfully connect the financial literacy badge(s) to course content through an assignment, discussion, reflection, or other learning activity. Offering badges for extra credit is allowed, but extra credit alone does not qualify for the Financial Education Innovator stipend. The stipend supports thoughtful integration of financial education into the curriculum.
